Re: Roundabouts

As I was working on an ordinance update to prohibit people from placing snow and ice onto cul-de-sac islands I saw we had no ordinance prohibiting vehicle from parking on or in roundabouts. We have had this problem in the Town of Ledgeview so an ordinance was created. Since the village is soon to gain another roundabout, I thought it might be prudent to have an ordinance in place.

The ordinance would prohibit parking in or on a roundabout except for authorized personnel.

Village Board is asked to amend the ordinance allowing for changes to the Streets and Sidewalk ordinance.

**CHAPTERS 340 TO 348
TRAFFIC REGULATIONS**

340.0011 NO PARKING ZONES.

A. When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or part of streets described in Schedule D during the times set forth in the schedule, except to comply with the directions of a traffic officer or traffic control signal or sign.

B. No person shall park a vehicle on or upon, or so as to cross or obstruct or in any manner intrude upon, or over any part of any public sidewalk, public walkway, public median area, or public park area.

C. No person shall park, stop or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, whether temporarily or otherwise, upon any portion of any street, highway, or parking facility reserved for handicapped persons and which have been so designated by any official traffic sign and district marker or parking meter indicating such restriction, except for vehicles displaying special registration plates issued under the provisions of Section 341.4 (1), (1a), (1m) or (1q), Wisconsin Statutes, or prominently display a special identification card for the physically disabled, which is issued under the provisions of Section 343.51(1), Wisconsin Statutes, or vehicles registered in another jurisdiction and displaying a registration plate, card or emblem issued by the other jurisdiction which designates the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person.

D. Roundabouts. No person shall park, stop or leave standing any vehicle, trailer or equipment, whether attended or unattended, in or on a roundabout.

(1) This subsection does not apply to vehicles, trailers or equipment used in highway maintenance for construction work service or public works service if the nature of the work is such as to require the stopping or standing of the vehicle, trailer or equipment in or on the roundabout.

(2) This subsection does not apply to vehicles, trailers or equipment used to maintain the roundabout to include landscaping or lawn service if the nature of the work is such as to require the stopping of the vehicle, trailer or equipment in or on the roundabout.

(E)D. Authority to Issue Parking Citations. In addition to duly authorized Law Enforcement Officers the following individuals are authorized to issue parking tickets for all parking violations under this Chapter including Section 7.05 Abandoned Vehicles:
