## ADDITIONAL 2014 REPORT INFORMATION

The cadet program currently has ten cadets assigned. The number has grown and shrunk as cadets leave for jobs and new cadets are hired.

We had two crossing guards retire in 2014 and one resign. We hired new guards and have 11 full time guards and ten substitutes. We also purchased two more portable crosswalk signs. Both were placed at the new roundabout on Hoffman Road and Libal Street. We posted two guards at the roundabout when it was opened.

Ten ordinances were updated or created to include Clear Water Prohibition, Nuisance-Pool, Fence, and Parking of Watercraft, Utility Trailers, Motor Homes, Recreational and Commercial Vehicles, Neighborhood Electric Vehicles, Snow on Street, Round About Parking, Animal Threat or Attack and Leash, as well as fees.

Only three violation citations were issued in 2014, two for one resident and another for a landlord. Both are repeat offenders.

51 invoices were mailed to residents concerning bulk and brush collection and eight invoices mailed for grass mowing. Some of these invoices were voided for various reasons.

Attended the annual American Association of Code Enforcement conference held in Chicago.

Animal Control went through a change which will be explained by Monica Hoff/Animal Control.

### **Summary:**

In November, the Village of Allouez started utilizing the CART (Citizen Animal Response Team). These on call volunteers provide a safe and humane response for both domestic animals and injured wildlife at a savings of approximately \$10-\$15 per call.

The Bay Area Humane Society continues to provide quality care for the stray animals of the Village of Allouez. In addition, they provided foster care, surgery and eventual



adoption for at least 15 feral kittens at no charge to the village. They work closely with Allouez Animal Control to provide spay /neuter surgeries for feral cats in the Allouez area.
