## **Allouez Historic Preservation**

The village has a few things going on in the realm of historic preservation. We currently have two municipal buildings up for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places. These buildings are the Allouez Pump House and the Allouez Water Department. The Wisconsin Historic Preservation Review Board will make their recommendation on these two buildings to the National Park Service in May, which is very exciting. Along these lines, the village is also looking at creating the first ever historic district in Allouez. We will be applying for a grant in the fall to hire a consultant to work on the nomination process and come up with a historic preservation plan for the district. The area the village is looking at is along

Miramar Drive. Residents in this area were invited to speak with a representative from the Wisconsin Historical Society at the Historic Preservation Committee meeting (open to the public) in which the



representative went over the benefits for listing a home or district to the National Register. The Wisconsin Historical Society recognizes May as Historic Preservation Month. The village is looking to draft a resolution recognizing May as Historic Preservation Month in the village.
