This memo is in regard to the two sewer backup claims by Tomcheck and Pascoe.

Both claims for reimbursement were submitted by the homeowner's insurance companies which have already reimbursed their insured's for the damages.

These backups occurred as a result of the heavy rains on December 14, 2015. Over two days the Village experienced more than 4" of rainfall. This rainfall on saturated ground resulted in excess sanitary sewer flows and the need for the Village to bypass pump out of the sewer system to try to reduce the amount of basement backup's.

There were a number of basement backups, but these are the only two claims have been received for.

Since this is an act of nature and therefore out of Village control, the Village has discretionary immunity and should deny these claims.

As you know, Statewide Services, Inc. administers the claims for the League of Wisconsin Municipalities Mutual Insurance, which provides the insurance coverage for the Village of Allouez. We are in receipt of the above-captioned claim involving a backup of sewer water into the claimant properties. Both matters are subrogation claims presented by the claimant carriers.

Our investigation has revealed that the Village was not negligent for this incident. Therefore, we recommend that the Village disallow this claim pursuant to the Wisconsin Statute for disallowance of claim 893.80(1g). The disallowance of the claim in this manner will shorten the statute of limitations period to six months.

Both losses occurred when the Village drainage system became overwhelmed by an onslaught of rain—an event which the Village obviously could not control. Furthermore, the Village has discretionary immunity for the "....acts of designing, planning and implementing a sewer system..." along with discretionary immunity "regarding decisions a) to adopt a water works system; b) to select and place pipe in the ground; and c) in the continued existence of such pipe."

Given the Village is not liable for the loss, and given the immunities in place for the Village, we recommend that the claim be disallowed.

I have enclosed a sample Notice of Disallowance for your use, should you choose to use it, or you may use your own. Please send your disallowance, on your letterhead, directly to the claimant subrogation carriers at the above listed addresses. These should be sent certified or registered (restricted) mail, and must be received by the claimants within 120 days after you received the claim. Please send me copies of the letters for our file.
