Absentee voting is underway for the primary. August 4^{th} at 5 pm is the last day for electors to request absentee ballots by mail for the Partisan Primary and August 5^{th} at 5 pm is the last day electors can vote absentee in the Clerk's Office. Our office is open for absentee voting from 8 am -4:00 pm. On August 4^{th} and 5^{th} we will be open until 5:00 pm.

August 5th at 5 pm is the last day to register in person at the Clerk's Office to vote at the Partisan Primary.
