§ 151-11_Keeping animals; hen license; limit on number of animals.

No person shall own, harbor or keep in his possession more than two cats and two dogs on any lot zoned as residential, with the exception that a litter of pups or kittens, or a portion of a litter, may be kept for a period of time not exceeding eight weeks from birth. If more than one family resides on any particular lot, the person exceeding the limitation imposed by this subsection is in violation thereof. In no event shall any person have more than four animals at a residence, except upon issuance of a waiver as hereafter provided.

The above requirement for the number of animals may be waived with the approval of the Village Administrator. The total number of preexisting animals shall be a factor in considering whether to grant or deny the requested waiver. Such application for waiver shall first be made to the Village Clerk-Treasurer and shall be referred to the Animal Control/Humane Officer for an investigation and recommendation to the Administrator. The petitioner must provide signed letters (including name, address and phone) from all adjacent property owners indicating that there have not been any problems with animals at the requesting residence (i.e., excessive barking, animals running loose, unsanitary conditions) and that they approve of the additional number of animals being requested. The decision of the Administrator may be appealed to the Village Board.



REQUEST TO EXCEED THE NUMBER OF ANIMALS ALLOWED PER VILLAGE ORDINANCE 151.11(F)

In no event shall any person have more than four (4) animals at a residence, except upon issuance of a waiver as here and after provided.

RE: Your Request to Exceed the Number of Animals Allowed

Dear Rachel,

I writing to inform you that I will not be recommending approval for your request to exceed the number of animals allowed per Village Ordinance 151.11(F).

As I have explained to you on the phone, you have failed to get approval from all adjacent property owners for this request of 3 dogs and 2 cats on your property of 300 Orchard Lane. Through our conversations, you obtained the American Stafforshire Terrier named Lucy after already residing at 300 Orchard Ln with 2 other dogs. For these reasons I have to recommend not approving this request at this time.

Said ordinance reads.

No person shall own, harbor or keep in his possession more than two cats and two dogs on any lot zoned as residential, with the exception that a litter of pups or kittens, or a portion of a litter, may be kept for a period of time not exceeding eight weeks from birth. If more than one family resides on any particular lot, the person exceeding the limitation imposed by this subsection is in violation thereof.
