



1. All street intersections along the event route are to be supervised by person 19 years of age or older. 2. Events will allowed only during daylight hours. 3. No events will be allowed during regular week day rush hours. 4. The Village of Allouez will not provide barricades for any events; however the Village will provide traffic cones on an availability basis. The cones must be picked up and returned by the event sponsors. The Village will charge for any missing traffic cones. The village may require a cash deposit from which the cost of missing cones will be deducted. 5. The permittee at it so les cost shall obtain and maintain general liability insurance for the activity in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 for damages arising out of personal injuries to any one person and \$250,000.00 for damages to property, in any one accident, and shall furnish the Village with a certificate of insurance naming the Village as an additional insured not less than five (6) business days prior to the start of the event. The permittee (and in case of individuals, partnership and associations, the names responsible person and the person signing this agreement) shall indemnify and save harmless the Village and its officers, employees and representatives, against any and all injuries and damages to persons and property, and shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the Village and its officers, employees and representatives, and all injuries and damages to persons and property, and shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the Village and its officers, employees and representatives, which in any way results from or arise out of such activity. 5.) Letter From the President, Donajane Brasch

NAMI Brown County is continuing to grow in Brown County and surrounding areas. We are here to help you whether you are the person living with a mental illness or parent, child, spouse, caregiver or loved one of someone with a mental illness.

NAMI offers support groups and educational classes to help with the process of recovery. No one can handle this disease by themselves. Please check through our educational classes and support groups and see which one would be beneficial to you. There is no charge for any of the services that we offer.

This has been a great year for us reaching out to the Brown County Sheriff's Department jail guards with a one day, 8 hour condensed version of our Crisis Intervention Partners training. In 6 different sessions, we trained over 160 jail guards. This was accomplished with a generous grant from The Green Bay

The "Crisis Intervention Partners Training", a two-day workshop, modeled after the CIT (Crisis Intervention Training) format for police officers, is designed for individual who work in professions related to crisis services (correction officers, EMS personnel, fire fighters, social workers, educators, hospital and emergency room personnel, etc.). This training has been successful with 40 in attendance. This training was made possible with a grant secured by the Green Bay Police Department. We consider the CIT (Crisis Intervention Training) for police officers as one of our top priorities, 25 new officers took the training this spring with a grant secured by the Green Bay Police Dept.

The 5th NAMI Spring Gala was on Sunday, May 9th, and our presenter was District Attorney John Luestcher from the Brown County Mental Health Court. Awards were given to:

- Mary Mason from Bellin Health Psychiatric Center for Mental Health Service Provider of the Year;
- Mike Byrne as NAMI Brown County Volunteer of the Year;
- Bill Thompson for the Peer Award; and
- Brittany Georgia for teen volunteer of the year.

Additionally, three awards were given to ST Paper, Bellin Health Psychiatric Center, and the Green Bay Packers as top sponsors for the 2014 NAMI Brown County Walk

Mark your calendars for Saturday, September 24, 2016 for our 9th annual NAMIWalks, which is held at Green Isle Park. The money raised helps us to continue to offer our services and programs free to those who need them the most. This is our main fundraiser of the year.
