

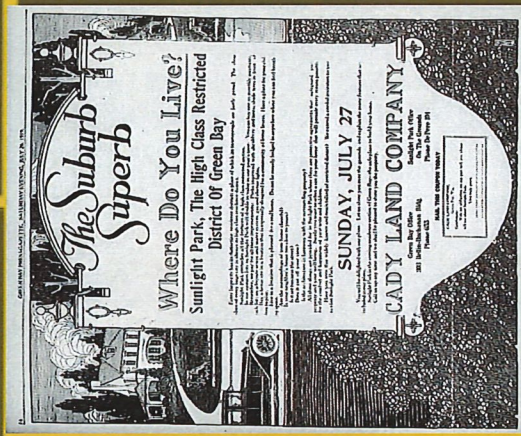
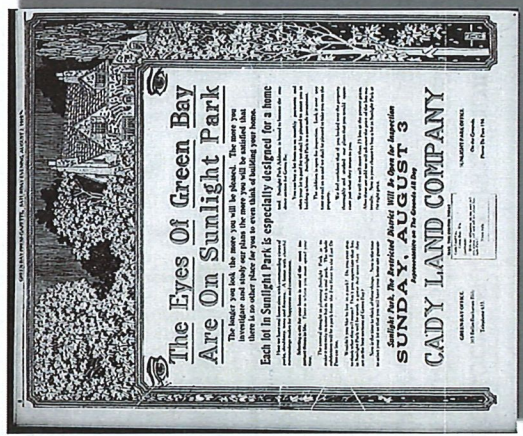
Sunlight Park

FACTS

- Originally 200 lots were plotted but over time parcels consolidated to form the 100 lots in Sunlight Park today.
- The land currently known as Sunlight Park was originally named Central Park and had a ravine running from north to south.



- To attract upscale buyers and protect home values, the Cady Land Company advertised Sunlight Park as a "restricted district" and banned chickens, billboards, and factories from the district.

Sunlight Park Centennial Timeline

In **1932**, Sunlight Park's first resident, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Hume moved into their new home. Later, in **1937**, Mr. and Mrs. Roger Minahan moved into their new residence on the corner of St. Francis Drive and Langlade Road.

1949, marked significant expansion in Sunlight Park, as sewer and water mains were installed throughout the neighborhood.

By **1952**, the Cady Land Company's tradition of advertising the names of prominent new residents in Sunlight Park had been retired.

By **1919**, the Cady Land Company had spent two years platting Sunlight Park on the land formerly known as the Old Cleven Farm.

In March of **2003**, the Village of Allouez Board took up a request to rename Sunlight Park to Basten Park. The motion failed.
