



## Planning on voting in the upcoming General Election on November 8th but not yet registered?

The deadline to register to vote by mail or online **is October 19<sup>th</sup>**. To register to vote online, click here- <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/Register-To-Vote>

Individuals can register on Election Day at their designated polling place. Additionally, if you prefer to register in-person at the Clerk's Office, our office hours are Monday through Thursday, 7:00 AM – 4:30 PM, and Friday 7:00 AM - 11:00 AM. (November 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> office is open until 5:00pm). Last day to register in-person at the Clerk's office is **November 4<sup>th</sup> at 5p.m.**

All mail requests must be received no later than **November 3<sup>rd</sup> by 5 pm.**
