MODIFY/ADOPT AGENDA

Retzlaff / Matuszek moved to add election of a committee chairperson as item 2a. Motion carried.

ELECTION OF A CHAIRPERSON

Fuller opened the floor for nominations. Fuller, O'Rourke, Trester were nominated. Fuller closed nominations.

Retzlaff / Matuszek moved to nominate O'Rourke as co-chair for pedestrians, Trester as co-chair for bicyclists, and Fuller as moderator of meetings. Motion carried.

MINUTES FROM DECEMBER 10, 2015

Retzlaff / Beyler moved to approve minutes dated December 10, 2015. Motion carried.

PUBLIC APPEARANCES

REVIEW RESULTS FROM THE ONLINE BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN SURVEY

Fuller went over the results from the online Bicycle and Pedestrian Survey. The results will be emailed to the committee as well as to those who left their contact information in the survey and wished to be kept up to date throughout the planning process.

DISCUSS OUTLINE OF THE COMPREHENSIVE BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PLAN

Fuller went over the proposed outline of the plan. The outline included an introduction, plan development, analysis of conditions, strategies, recommendations, areas of further study, and appendices. The committee discussed what should be included in each section and made the

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suggestion that an executive summary be included and "Facilities Planned" should be substituted for "Recommendations."

The committee will also work on the "Plan Vision" via email, with action on a final vision at the next meeting. The committee acknowledged that the vision might change as the plan is developed and will reassess when the plan is complete.

DISCUSSION OF COMPLETE STREETS CONCEPTS IN NEW DEVELOPMENT

O'Rourke presented plans of creating "walking loops," connecting Arrowhead Drive, St. Mary's Boulevard, and the streets connecting to Linck Court through a series of sidewalks. Existing villageowned land and stormwater easements could be the first phase of the walking loops, connecting Sunlight Park/Arrowhead Drive with St. Mary's Boulevard and St. Mary's Boulevard with the commercial development just north of St. Mary's Boulevard on Riverside Drive, through an existing stormwater easement. Prior to the sale of the village-owned land on Riverside Drive (parcels AL-125-7 & AL-125-8), a perpetual easement should be recorded for public pedestrian access.

O'Rourke / Trester moved to recommend the Village Board investigate having a perpetual public easement recorded for pedestrian access prior to selling the land. The easement would follow the existing stormwater easement / historic Doty Creek. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS ON RIVERSIDE DRIVE

The committee discussed the need for increasing the number of safe crossings on Riverside Drive. These crossings could connect the proposed "walking loops" to the stormwater retention pond and the Fox River Trail.
